# AND MANY THANKS TO ALL ENTRANTS, SPONSORS, AND JUDGES FOR PARTICIPATING IN OUR 44th ANNUAL POETRY CONTEST!

#### Participation:

- 83 poets entered 883 poems in 27 categories.
- 36 of the contestants were members of PSI (approx. one half of our membership).
- Entries came from 20 states and 1 Canadian province.
- Eight categories had at least 40 entries.
- The Glenna Glee: One and Only category had the most entries with 52.

#### Placings:

- 64 contestants had at least one placing at any level.
- 28 of those were PSI members.
- 46 contestants had at least one placing of 1st, 2nd, or 3rd.
- 19 of those were PSI members.

#### Notable Individual Achievements:

- Mary A. Couch\*: 8 placings, including 1 First Place and 4 others in the Top 3
- Jerri Hardesty: 8 placings, including 1 First Place and 4 others in the Top 3
- Pat Barnes: 7 placings, including 4 Second Places and a Third Place
- Catherine Moran: 3 First Places, plus a Third Place and an Honorable Mention
- Amy Wray Irish: 3 First Places

#### Prizes:

- Prize money totaled \$1879.80, plus one free one-year membership in PSI (\$18 value).
- PSI members earned prize money totaling \$695.20.

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- SOME COMMENTS FROM THE JUDGES (# indicates the category judged):
- #1: This was HARD. They're all good and deserve recognition.
- #2: Several wonderful poems in this group. Winning choices often came down to fine poetry points.

  To all the poets: Thank you for sharing your creative wonders.
- #4: Key elements of a good limerick include strong meter and humor, even bawdiness. The winner in this category definitely meets that definition!
- #6: Always a difficult task, judging a poetry contest reminds me of the place where aesthetics and personal taste intersect. While personal taste cannot be removed totally, I tried as earnestly as possible to judge according to aesthetic quality. After reading the set of poems several times, I selected a "top ten" list. Then, I winnowed that list down to four that, in my estimate, reflected adherence to the stated subject and showed artistic merit superior to the others.
- #7: My choices were guided by the quality of the poem, as well as my love of nature. The author didn't need to say "Mounds" for me to know it was pure Indiana. Soldiers and Sailors Monument is also the defining feature in City Story.
- #8: Good set of Spoon Rivers. Also read some good poems that could not be called Spoon Rivers.
- #9: If a poem does not follow rules I don't even read it. Numbers of lines, etc. There was only a hair's difference between 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, & 3<sup>rd</sup>.
- #11: We enjoyed judging these as a team in our poetry club. It was a reminder that along with appreciation for excellent technique, there is a certain amount of subjective preference each judge has for certain poetic qualities and subjects. We are in agreement that these 6 winners are worthy of recognition. We also want to encourage some of the poets who did not win. Maybe your poem did not speak to the group as a whole, but spoke to one of us. Keep working and polishing. Thank you to all who chose to enter!
- #12: Enjambment serves the winning poem well by accelerating the reading of it and camouflaging its hard end rhymes illustrating the vagaries of Time's erasing hand.
- #13: I enjoyed reading poems, which touched my heart!
- #14: It was good to see how many poets love the plant life all around us and there were so many different views and thoughts. I can also see that both rhyming and meter have become somewhat passe' since one or the other (or sometimes both) were rather missing from some entries. Beautiful, flowing, thoughtful, and well done free verse is certainly important and enjoyed, but I do hope the world of poetry doesn't completely forget meter and rhyme.
- #15: Reminder: syllable count should be precise 2, 4, 6, 8, 2. A Cinquain is a single thought or story description in poetry form. The poem should flow or be lyrical.
- #18: I was thrilled with the wide variety of patterns represented by this group of poets. I admit I sincerely wished I had more opportunities to list Honorable Mentions. Well done poets!
- #19: 1<sup>st</sup> Place: Such a beautiful way to encourage lyricists, poets and novelists. Intellectually stimulating, well done. 2<sup>nd</sup> Place: Praise to the author for this inspiring message. 3<sup>rd</sup> Place: Beautiful vision. Hope lives.
- #21: We really enjoyed the creative efforts put forth. We love to be surprised after reading the poem to see what piece of artwork inspired it.
- #22: A fine collection of Rictameters, most were true to form, all engaged this judge who has respect for all the entries, but alas, the top poems were the ones that impressed me the

- most, that I thought best satisfied the category theme and subject. Thanks to all that entered this category.
- #24: I enjoyed reading the entries. Unfortunately, a number of them did not follow the strict iambic pentameter rhythmic pattern.
- #25: It was very difficult to pick winners in this group—the poems covered many areas and were outstanding.

Note: The judge this year for any given category may not be the same in future years.
