Below is the final Amendment proposal for your consideration. This will be voted upon during the Fall Rendezvous Business Portion of our gathering. The final amended By Laws then, will become a legal record and submitted to the National Organization Legal Section.
- We welcome Nancy Simmonds, from Northeast Indiana Poets, as our new Second Vice President. Already she has jumped into our dynamic group and has taken the reins of the newly-created Spring Fling Committee. Looking forward to working with you, Nancy!! Deborah Petersen has accepted the vote to remain as President; David Allen will remain our 1st Vice President and continue as our Poetry Contest Chair and the Nominating Committee Chair. Linda Eaton has accepted to stay on as our Manningham Chair, an appointed position.
- With the elected Executive Committee positions on a two –year time frame, we will be accepting nominations for our Treasurer and our Secretary positions. We are also seeking assistance for a Web Master and Spring Fling Committee members.

Constitution Amendment proposal —to be voted on during Fall Rendezvous

Currently reads:

ARTICLE IV – GOVERNMENT

The organization shall be governed by a Board of Directors consisting of the Presidents of all affiliate clubs or their alternates, all elected officers of PSI, the chairmen of all standing committees of PSI and all past presidents of PSI.

The jurisdiction of the Board of Directors shall be the entire state of Indiana and shall include all affiliate clubs, but shall never interfere with the internal affairs or management of any affiliated group.

Propose we amend it to read:

The organization shall be governed by an Executive Committee consisting of all elected officers of PSI. The Executive Committee shall never interfere with the internal affairs or management of any affiliated group.

Reasoning:

In practice, we have not been governed by a board of directors as described in our constitution for years. We are a smaller body now, and more focused on individual members rather than clubs. This amendment would change the constitution to reflect how we actually have been functioning for years.

Like a fleeing bird from my cranny swiftly

I passed from my temple.

Like a bird they caused me to fly.
